Regional Council's Rangitāiki Floodway multi-stage operation, designed to take the pressure off the Rangitāiki River in a flood event and help protect the Edgecumbe community.

Tracks Concrete contributed to Stage 5A, which involved shaping and rebuilding the stopbanks, allowing water to exit into the Rangitäiki River mouth at two places, instead of one. The work required transporting approved construction fill, dismantling the existing stopbank, uplifting and stockpiling cut material, and construction of the new stopbank.

Ken says the job was made more efficient with the use of their gear from Doherty Couplers and Attachments.

"We placed the rip rap with a D-Lock hydraulic hitch and were able to swiftly change buckets and bucket thumbs to perform more precise works. Having Doherty Attachments on our machines allow us to change each attachment quickly when the job requires a different approach." Tracks Concrete's first purchase from Doherty was back in 2006.

"Doherty was new to the market and being a local Bay of Plenty company based in Tauranga, we decided to give them a go and have been using them ever since," Ken says.

Ken believes they have acquired more than 50 Doherty products over the years, including weed and trenching buckets, ripper hooks, and bucket clamps – the brand's excellent productivity and efficiency are why Tracks Concrete haven't looked back, he says.
